In its 16th year, Act Six continues to be driven by the premise that our communities are stronger when everyone has an equal opportunity to receive an education and a seat at the table. The Act Six program proves that when young, diverse leaders (YOU) are empowered with education, relationships and resources, they persist and transform. From student body presidents, to traveling abroad and domestically, to tackling our communities' biggest challenges, you all have proven to be leaders during a critical time.

The US Census Bureau predicts that by 2044 the majority of our nation will be people of color. Representation matters, and as our nation's demographics continues to shift, we need to lean in and lead more than ever to ensure our systems work for everyone to create thriving communities that are vibrant, equitable and just.

In 2018, having selected 940 scholars and alumni across the network, we are asking the question: How do our Act Six scholars lead here and now? How do we push each other to be the leaders we have been called to be? We hope this Convention will challenge you to think and live beyond yourself. You will be asked and reminded to lead for each other and for your community. It's critical that we remember our roots as we persist and prepare for the future.

Hotel Information

The Red Lion River Inn is the 2018 Act Six Convention host hotel. The hotel is in walking distance to Gonzaga. We are grateful for the hospitality shown to us by the hotel staff. Please respect this business by handling yourself in a respectful manner while on hotel property – walk and conduct yourself quietly in hallways and stairwells, limit loud music, do not use alcohol or drugs, observe quiet hours, and do not smoke in your room or in hotel buildings.

HOTEL QUIET HOURS: 10:00 pm – 8:00 am (inside and outside of the hotel). Please observe these hours out of respect for your fellow Act Six scholars, staff and guests, and other paying hotel guests. Remember, you are representing yourself and Act Six.

BREAKFAST AT HOTEL: Breakfast vouchers are included in your hotel cost (four vouchers per room). Please take your voucher to the restaurant where there will be a hotel breakfast buffet. Breakfast opens at 6:00 am on Saturday and Sunday. Plan your morning to arrive early to avoid the breakfast rush and eat before the morning plenary sessions.

SHARED ROOMS & ROOMMATES: Your Convention fees cover a shared hotel room with up to four total scholars per room. Hotel rooms are double queens (two queen size beds). We did our best to accommodate your roommate preferences. Roll away beds are not available. You must choose to share a bed with a fellow scholar or sleep on the floor.

NO CHARGES TO ROOM: No additional charges may be made directly to your hotel room. You and your roommates are responsible for any damages or fees incidentally made to your room.

GROUP MEETING ROOM: The Clearwater banquet room on the first floor in the lobby is reserved for scholar use on Friday and Saturday evenings from 8:30 pm – 11:00 pm. This is a great gathering place for small and large groups. Games, light snacks, and water are available.

HOTEL POOL: The Red Lion has two pools and they are open until 11:00 pm. Please follow the posted pool rules (NO food or drink allowed on pool decks) and wear proper swimming attire.

STAY NEARBY: For your safety, stay on or near the hotel and Gonzaga in the evenings. Avoid walking too far off site or riding in personal vehicles. Make sure you walk with someone if you must walk outside after dark.

CONVENTION TRANSPORTATION: Roundtrip transportation will be provided between the Red Lion and Whitworth University on Friday evening. The Red Lion is within walking distance of Gonzaga University so give yourself enough time to walk from the hotel to the campus. It's about a 15-minute walk.

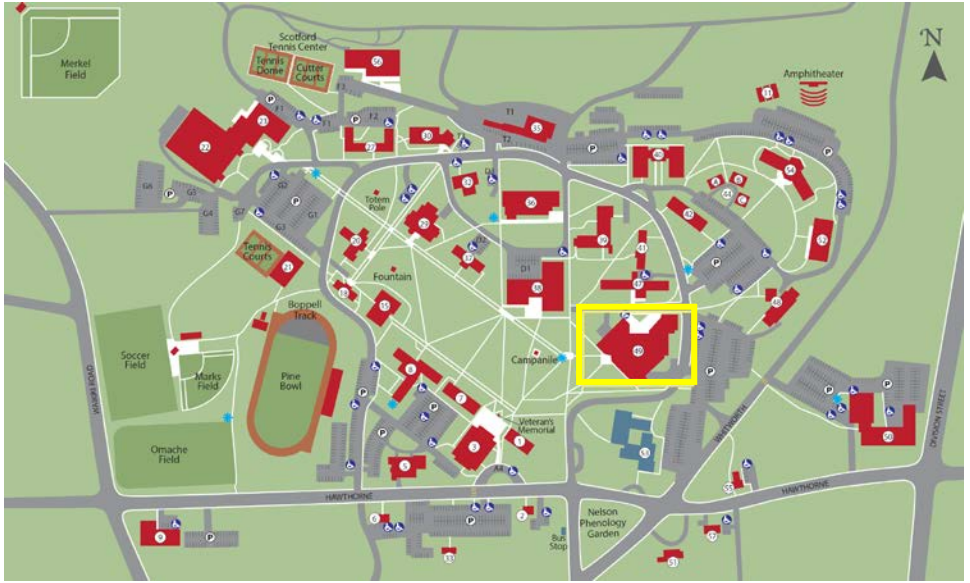

Gonzaga University Campus Map

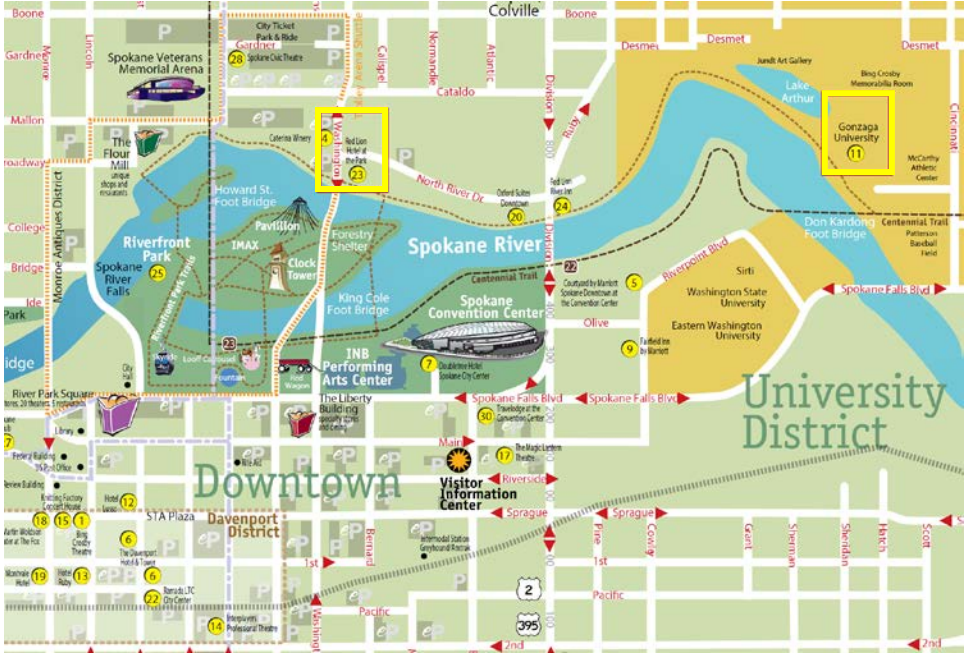
